After reviewing the nominations, the committee has selected **Officer Juliana Ehnnot #130** as the recipient.

Sergeant Michael DeHoratius #649 wrote in his nomination of Officer Juliana Ehnnot #130 the following:

Officer Ehnnot began her career in Upper Darby in December of 2023, quickly becoming a reliable member of the Patrol Division. Officer Ehnnot has completed Accident Reconstruction training as well as Drone Pilot training and is slated for a near future Field Training Officer school. Officer Ehnnot works the busy PTP car, handling a large call volume and needing little to no assistance with routine paperwork or criminal complaints. This quarter, she handled 267 calls for service as well as assisted in an additional 196 calls. She has stepped up to help the squad with the Field Training Program when needed.

Officer Ehnnot has been involved in extended accident reconstruction investigations throughout this quarter, devoting hours of time in addition to her patrol duties. One accident (25-068988) at Providence and Hilldale resulted in the death of the bicycle rider. Officer Ehnnot worked tirelessly on the investigation throughout this time period, ultimately resulting in probable cause to charge the operator with Homicide by Vehicle, which will be traversing the courts in the coming months. At the same time, Officer Ehnnot also began working on a reconstruction of an accident involving a motorcycle at West Chester Pike and Pennock Road in which the rider was seriously injured, and charges of Aggravated Assault while DUI may be pending following the current investigation.

In addition to handling this workload on 03/31/2026, officers were dispatched to the report of a stabbing at 23 Garrett Road. A male in grave condition was located with multiple stab wounds and heavy loss of blood. A description of the female actor was broadcast, and Officer Ehnnot observed the female matching the description and detained her without incident. The female was identified as the actor and subsequently charged with attempted homicide following the full investigation.
